

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), Takapoto Estate Limited (the licensee) is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at 37 Plantation Road Cambridge 3494 and known as TAKAPOTO ESTATE, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

This licence is not endorsed under section 40 of the Act - the licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

Conditions

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold Monday to Sunday, from 9.00am to 10.00pm.
- (b) No alcohol may be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day.
- (c) The area where alcohol is to be sold is described in the plan date stamped as received by the Waipā District Licensing Committee on 18 March 2021.
- (d) The entire premises is designated as a supervised area (no persons under 18 years can be in the area unless with their parent or legal guardian).
- (e) A properly appointed certificated, acting or temporary manager must be on duty and on the premises at all times when the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- (f) A manager's register (as required by s.232 of the Act) is to be maintained and available on site.
- (g) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed at all points of sale and the licensee must ensure all staff receive training in their responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- (h) There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
- (i) Drinking water must be freely available and displayed whenever alcohol is being supplied by way of complimentary tastings.
- (j) The Licensee must ensure the following are displayed;
 - i) A sign to be seen from outside the principal entrance stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol.
 - ii) A copy of the original licence with all the conditions, just inside the principal entrance so persons entering can read it.
 - iii) A sign in a prominent place identifying the duty manager.

Remote sale conditions

- (k) Alcohol may be sold or supplied remotely at any time, on any day.
- (l) Alcohol must not be delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day, or between 11:00pm and 6:00am the following day.
- (m) The licensee must take reasonable steps to verify that the buyer and the receiver of an alcohol delivery is not under 18 years of age, and the receiver (where present) is not intoxicated.
- (n) A copy of the licence must be displayed on the Takapoto Estate internet site in a prominent place.

Duration

- i) Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force **until the expiry date shown at the bottom of this licence.**
- ii) If an application for the renewal of the licence is made in accordance with the Act before the licence expires, the licence will remain in force until that renewal application is determined (provided it is determined before the next anniversary of the licence).
- iii) If the licence is renewed, a replacement licence will be issued with an amended expiry date.
- iv) This licence automatically expires if a licence of the same type is issued in respect to the same licensed premises (i.e. to a new operator).
